Purpose: The Opportunity Funding directed to mental health services provides \$5.0 million in FY20, \$2.5 million in HB 225 (Annual Appropriations Act) and \$2.5 million authorized in HB 226 (One-Time Supplemental). With a total supplemental amount of \$7.5 million over three years, the total amount will be \$15 million *contingent on future appropriations*.

It shall be apportioned to schools which qualify for a Reading Interventionist under the Student Success Block Grant as detailed in House Bill 225 (the FY20 operating budget).

This funding shall be used by school districts and charter schools for *mental health services* in the form of school counselors, school social workers or licensed clinical social workers, school psychologists, and/or for additional reading supports for grades K-5. Services may include the employment of staff, where such funding may be used to cover 100 percent of personnel costs on a 10 to 12-month basis and/or contracted services.

This funding is allocated separately from the directed funds for English learners and low-income students.

Allocation Method: Amounts vary per school and that amount is indicated below. Each LEA has already received the first half of the funding; the second amount will be released upon receipt and approval of this application.

Overall summary

1. What will you do to offer mental health supports specifically to low-income and English language learners?

The addition of a school psychologist will enable us to provide additional small group counseling interventions as well as individual counseling supports and behavioral interventions as part of our Multi-tiered System of Supports. The school psychologist will support students who are low-income or English learners who have the need for tier 2 or 3 mental or behavioral health supports. Red Clay school psychologists follow the National Association of School Psychologist (NASP) Practice Model which provides both direct student interventions as well as indirect services such as consultation and collaboration with outside providers and family-based therapies. We will also be partnering with West Chester University to provide a Bounce Back program for our students and targeted primarily to our low income and EL students. Bounce Back is a school-based group intervention for elementary students exposed to stressful and traumatic events. This intervention is provided by Stevie N. Grasseti, Ph.D. Licensed Clinical Psychologist and his research team through West Chester University. With 20-50% of American children experiencing trauma within their families, at their schools, and in their communities. Bounce Back teaches students ways to cope with and recover from traumatic experiences, so they can get back to doing what they want to do and need to do.

2. How will the funding also assist students not in those two subgroups?

The addition of a school psychologist would allow us to provide Tier 2 and 3 interventions for students who are referred through the Problem Solving Team process regardless of subgroup. These services will be provided using a data-based decision-making process to determine the type of intervention needed.

The Bounce Back program is available to all students at Richardson Park; however, we are targeting the needs of our low income and EL students. If parents provide consent to the clinicians, they are individually screened to determine if they qualify for the program. The Bounce Back program includes 10 group sessions, 1-3 group parent sessions, and 2-3 individual student sessions.

3. What kind of specialist are you hiring (school counselor, school social worker, licensed clinical social worker or school psychologist)?

School Psychologist and Stevie N. Grasseti, Ph.D. Licensed Clinical Psychologist contracted through West Chester University

4. Are you using this money for additional reading supports in addition to mental health services? If so, what types of services will be provided?

Funds will be used to purchase the following reading supports k-6 in our Opportunity Grant buildings. The purchase amount will be divided amongst seven identified schools after payroll and OEC for allocated employees.

Words Their Way Material- Each teacher will be provided with the teacher guide and the supplemental resources of this program. The Words Their Way framework is used to create the new Tier 2 and Tier 3 curriculum guides. Each stage-specific companion volume features a complete curriculum of reproducible sorts and detailed directions for teachers working with students in each stage of spelling development, from emergent through derivational relations. These materials will provide teachers with the "why" behind phonics patterns instruction and reproducible sorts that they can use daily in their classrooms when differentiating in their small groups. These materials are appropriate for specifically targeting EL students in small groups to work on deficiencies in phonics.

Reading Eggs Licenses-This is an individualized digital learning intervention tool. The program is built for grades K-6, focusing on foundation reading skills and moving into comprehension. The program is a sequential series of lessons that starts at a complete beginner's level. It develops essential reading skills in a progression that will take a non-reader through to a grade 2 reading level. Reading Eggspress then goes on to cover skills for children through to a grade 6 level. This would be a meaningful technology center that can be used during independent practice time. A great option for teachers to use chrome books in the classroom and allow our non-readers and EL students the opportunity to progress at their own pace and have extended learning.

Funds will be allocated to cover a portion of teacher substitutes to cover teachers for training on these new curricular materials.
